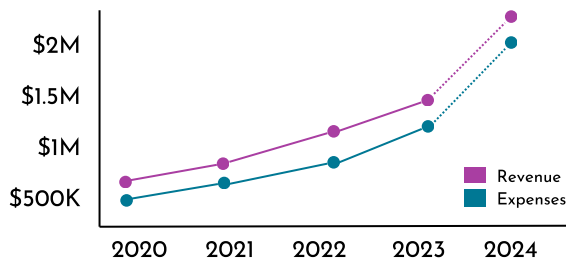
## IMPACT STRATEGY
